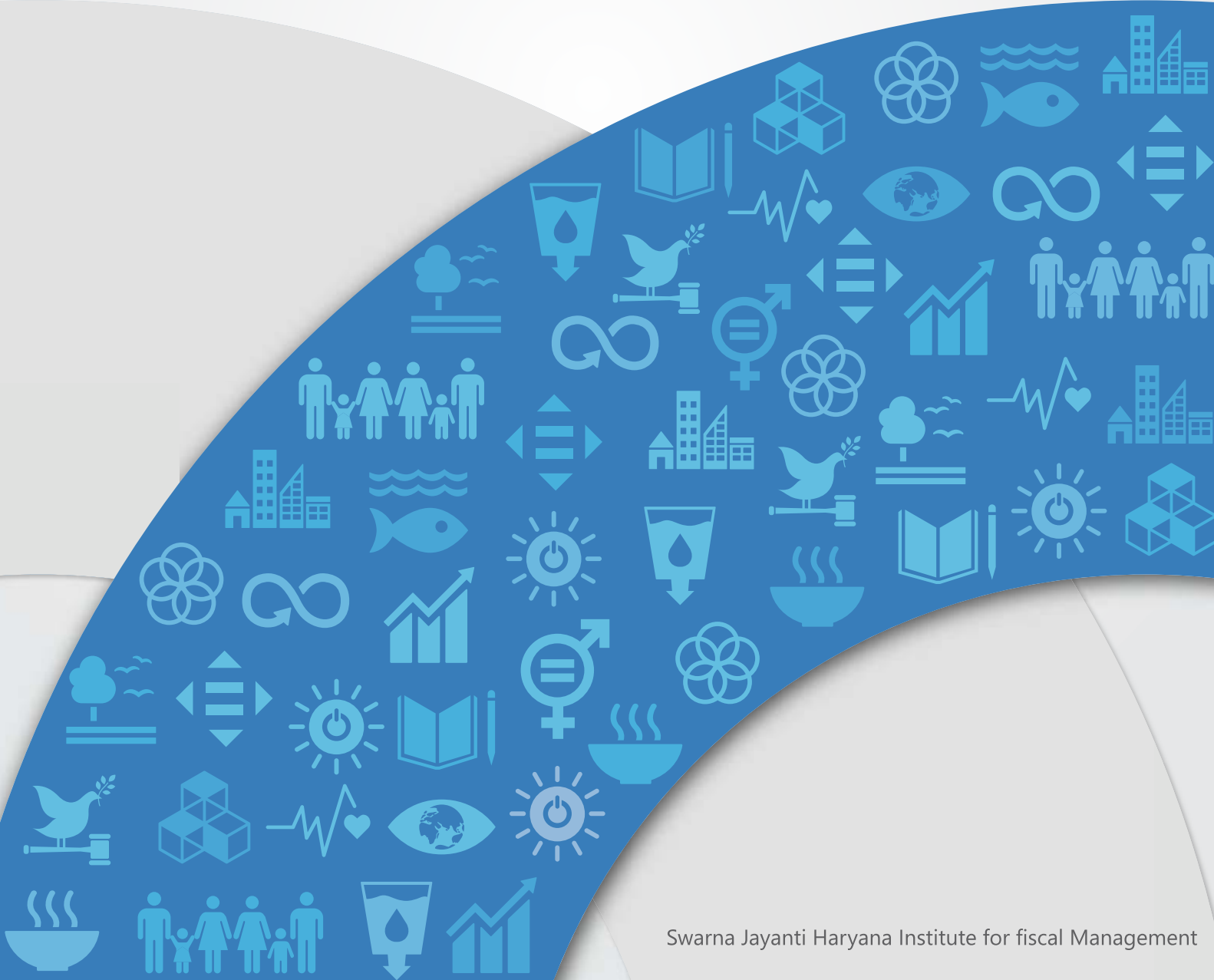

THE NEED FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

However, along the way it needs to address significant challenges like a low female to male child sex ratio, low literacy rates, malnutrition among children, a growing gap between rich and poor districts, unemployment in youth, a sinking water table and the recent environment challenge of stubble burning.

The way forward

It is evident that to meet the 2030 Agenda, a better than 'business as usual' approach is needed; where the goals are clear, with firm deadlines, resulting in concrete efforts.

Where government departments join hands and work in an integrated fashion and not in silos. Where private and public sectors work seamlessly together as partners in achieving the goals. And where all stakeholders and citizens participate actively in building a sustainable future.

To help achieve this transformation, a support framework to Government of Haryana at the SDG Coordination Centre was created.

PARTNERSHIP WITH UNDP

The Vision Document 'SDG VISION 2030' document is the fruit of a joint effort between the Government of Haryana and UNDP. On request from the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Haryana, Shri Manohar Lal the UN Resident Coordinators Office set up a UNDP State Office.

From July 2016 to June 2017, UNDP undertook various steps to give shape to the SDG VISION 2030 document and the Honourable Chief Minister Sh Manohar Lal launched 'Vision Document 2030' in Chandigarh on June 27, 2017 in the presence of United Nations Resident Coordinator (AI) Mr. Diego Palacios.

As the lead UN development agency, UNDP is well-placed to help implement the Goals. UNDP supports countries across the globe to achieve the SDGs through integrated solutions.
